
Trade Facilitation in Africa

>2016: Global trade flows




Note: North refers to developed economies; South, to developing and transition economies. Trade is measured from the export side.




Trade Facilitation in Africa

Low performances of Intra-African trade

Trade volume of Africa has increased while intra-African exports have stagnated.

Can African countries trade out of poverty?

- ✓ Structural transformation
- Export diversification
- ✓ In-country value addition
- ✓ Join Global Value Chains
 - Requires efficiency of customs and regulatory formalities
 - Requires efficient logistics and infrastructure

A new paradigm in international trade!

- ✓ The WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement (TFA)
- ✓ The African Continental Free Trade Area (CFTA)
- The Regional Economic Communities and the Customs Unions
- ✓ National TF reforms through the National Trade Facilitation Committees as agents of change




The WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement in Africa

- Africa expected to experience biggest benefits from the full implementation of the WTO TFA
 35% increase in exports
 16% reduction in trade costs (WTO, Trade Report, 2015)
- So far, only 29 African countries have ratified the WTO TFA out of a total of 54 African countries
- The notification of categories by African countries is slow with less than 60% of the countries having notified.

Trade Facilitation and the African Continental Free Trade Area (CFTA)

- March 2018: Launch of CFTA based on Regional Economic Communities
- CFTA expected to increase intra-African trade by 52.3% by eliminating import duties.
- CFTA Annex on Trade Facilitation
 Reforms to accompany domestic efforts in industrialization,
 Improve continental value chain towards exports and diversification



Implications of the CFTA on regional integration and national Trade Facilitation policies

- On the RECs: to advance efforts towards regional integration and harmonization of national TF frameworks. Ex. Tripartite COMESA-EAC-SADC (representing two thirds of African countries)
- On the Governments: to lead a national TF agenda which is compliant with the multilateral, continental and regional obligations
- On the NTFCs: As coordinating entities, to drive a process in which all trade logistics stakeholders from public and private sectors should be working together to implement the TF reforms



KEY FACTS FROM THE TRAIN FOR TRADE PROGRAMME 2010-2014




- 50 countries


