
Mauritania

Intra-Africa trade and tariff profile 2018







Mauritania is a member of both the Arab Maghreb Union (AMU) and The Community of Sahel-Saharan States (CEN-SAD).

The five member states of AMU are Algeria, Libya, Mauritania, Morocco and Tunisia. Although the AMU Treaty calls for a gradual move toward free circulation of goods, services, and factors of production no progress has been made thus far. Currently there is no free trade agreement in place.

CEN-SAD currently has member states. In 2013 a revised CEN-SAD Treaty was approved, but is yet to be ratified by the prerequisite quorum required for entry into force. Consequently there is currently no free trade agreement in place.

Although Mauritania is part of two RECS, AMU and CEN-SAD, neither of these RECs currently have free trade arrangements in place.

- Seven of Mauritania's main African destination markets are also members of CEN-SAD. Main destination markets outside CEN-SAD are Cameroon (4% of intra-Africa trade), South Africa (2%) and Equatorial Guinea (2%).
- Eight of the main African source markets are either members of CEN-SAD (Senegal, Mali, Egypt, Togo and Ivory Coast), AMU (Algeria) or both (Morocco and Tunisia). South Africa (4%) of intra-Africa imports) and eSwatini (2%) are the only two main source markets outside AMU and CEN-SAD.




Intra-Africa tariffs

All goods imported into Mauritania from other African countries are levied the MFN applied tariff which has four tariff bands – duty-free, 5%, 13% and 20%. At national tariff line level (HS10) Mauritania has 5499 tariff lines; the majority of which are 20% tariffs (40% of the tariff lines). 39% of the tariff lines have 5% import duties, while 17% of the tariff lines have 13% import duties. Only 4% of the tariff lines are duty-free.

Of the top 20 import products only 5 tariff lines are duty-free. These products are diesel for the fishing or bunkering industry, medicaments, oilcake, cereal residues and containers made from iron or steel used for compressed or liquefied gas.

- Of the products mainly imported by Mauritania from other African countries, most are levied a 5% tariff, including other vegetables, cement clinkers, helicopters, prepared explosives, certain diesel goods vehicles, dates and refined sugar in granules or powder.
- A limited number of the top import products are levied a 13% import duty.
- A 20% tariff is applicable to certain refined sugars, medium oils and preparations and diesel goods vehicles; plastic tanks with a capacity greater than 300 litres; insulated coaxial cable and milk and cream with a fat content greater than 1%, but less than 6%.
