### intra-Africa trade & tariff profile 2019 tralac trade law centre

Comoros is member of the Community of Sahel-Saharan States (CEN-SAD) and the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA), and the Southern African Development Community (SADC)

COMESA has 21 member states, 17 of which are part of the COMESA Free Trade Area - the DRC, Eritrea, Ethiopia and Somalia are all in the process of accession SADC has 16 member states - all the SACU

countries, Zimbabwe, Zambia, Mauritius, Mozambique and Malawi. 13 SADC member states are in a Free Trade Arrangement (FTA); Comoros, Angola (recently made an offer) and

DRC are yet to join.
CEN-SAD currently has 24 member states aspiring to establish an Economic Union which includes the free movement of goods, services and commodities. There is currently no free

trade agreement in place.


2. Intra-Africa trade

For 2019, 12% of Comoros' world exports & ignitions, vacuum flasks, rest of Africa. Intra-Africa exports amounted to garment. 79% of Comoros'

The main export products include electrical electric sound 10% of world imports were to and from the equipment, cloves, refrigerators, inverters & intra-Africa US\$6.1 million (348% increase compared to exports go to Madagascar, and 10% to 2018 exports). Intra-Africa imports amounted Tanzania. The main products imported by to US\$19.96 million (19% less than in 2018). Comoros from Africa include cane or beet sugar,

preserved fish, wheat or meslin flour, waters & animal feeding preparations. 26% of the imports are sourced from Mauritius, 21% from South Africa and 14% from Madagascar. Comoros mainly trade with Madagascar, Mauritius, South Africa & Tanzania - accounting for 79% of Comoros' intra-Africa trade

3. Intra-Africa tariffs & non-tariff cost of trade Most of the products from COMESA countries enter Comoros duty-free. Imports from countries outside COMESA countries face MFN applied duties. In 2019, Comoros' 2% of world & 14% of intra-Africa exports went to African countries outside COMESA. 5% of world & 45% of intra-Africa imports were sourced from African countries outside COMESA.

The main export products to African countries outside COMESA include refrigerators, cloves, iron waste & scrap & textile tents. All of Comoros' world imports of refrigerators, textile tents, fishing vessels, aluminum parts, baby clothes are sourced from outside COMESA. 68% of Comoros' exports to African countries COMESA go to Tanzania, 26% to Benin and 6% to South Africa.

The main import products include preserved fish. waters, raw sugar cane and milk & cream. All of Comoros' world imports live sheep, goats and matches are sourced from African countries outside COMESA. 46% of Comoros' imports from outside COMESA are sourced from South Africa, 29% from Tanzania, 20% from Morocco & 4% from Mozambique.



Sawing cutting machines, calculating machine, crushing machines, grinding automatic pneumatic tools, goods-vending machines, extruders, ball roller bearing, gaskets, electric motors and generators, machines and apparatus for the manufacture of boules or wafers, electrical transformers, static converters, primary cells and batteries, electric primary accumulators vacuum cleaners, food grinders and women and men mixers, tracksuits, suits, gloves, mittens and mitts, blankets and travelling rugs, bedlinen, table linen, toilet linen and kitchen linen, curtains, paperbags, tents, footwear, hair, human millstones, weighing machinery. mechanical appliances, raw hides and skins of bovine, electrical ignition.






Comoros' imports from outside COMESA and corresponding duties

18% of Comoros' intra-Africa & 71% of world imports of preserved or prepared sardines are sourced from African countries outside COMESA; also 11% of intra-Africa & 24% of world imports of waters; 11% of intra-Africa & 47% of world imports of raw sugar cane; 3% of intra-Africa & 23% of world imports of milk & cream of a fat content by weight of > 1% but <= 6%; 2% of intra-Africa & world imports of iron or steel bars; 2% of intra-Africa & all of world imports of milk and cream of a fat content by weight of <= 1%; 2% of intra-Africa & 32% of world imports of milk and cream of a fat content by weight of <= 1%; 2% of intra-Africa & 32% of world imports of flasks; and 2% of intra-Africa and all of world imports of live goats are sourced from African countries outside COMESA.

Categories of duties & % of 2019 imports in each category



11 of the top 20 products imported from outside COMESA are imported duty-free. These products include raw sugar cane, milk & cream, iron or steel bars, wood, waters. frozen chicken cuts, medicaments, animal feeding preparations and raw beet sugar. 2 20% duty is applied on imports of flasks and second-hand cothing. A 5% duty is applicable on imports of live animals (sheep & goats), mattresses, fresh apples, preserved or prepared sardines, waters, paperbags and matches.
