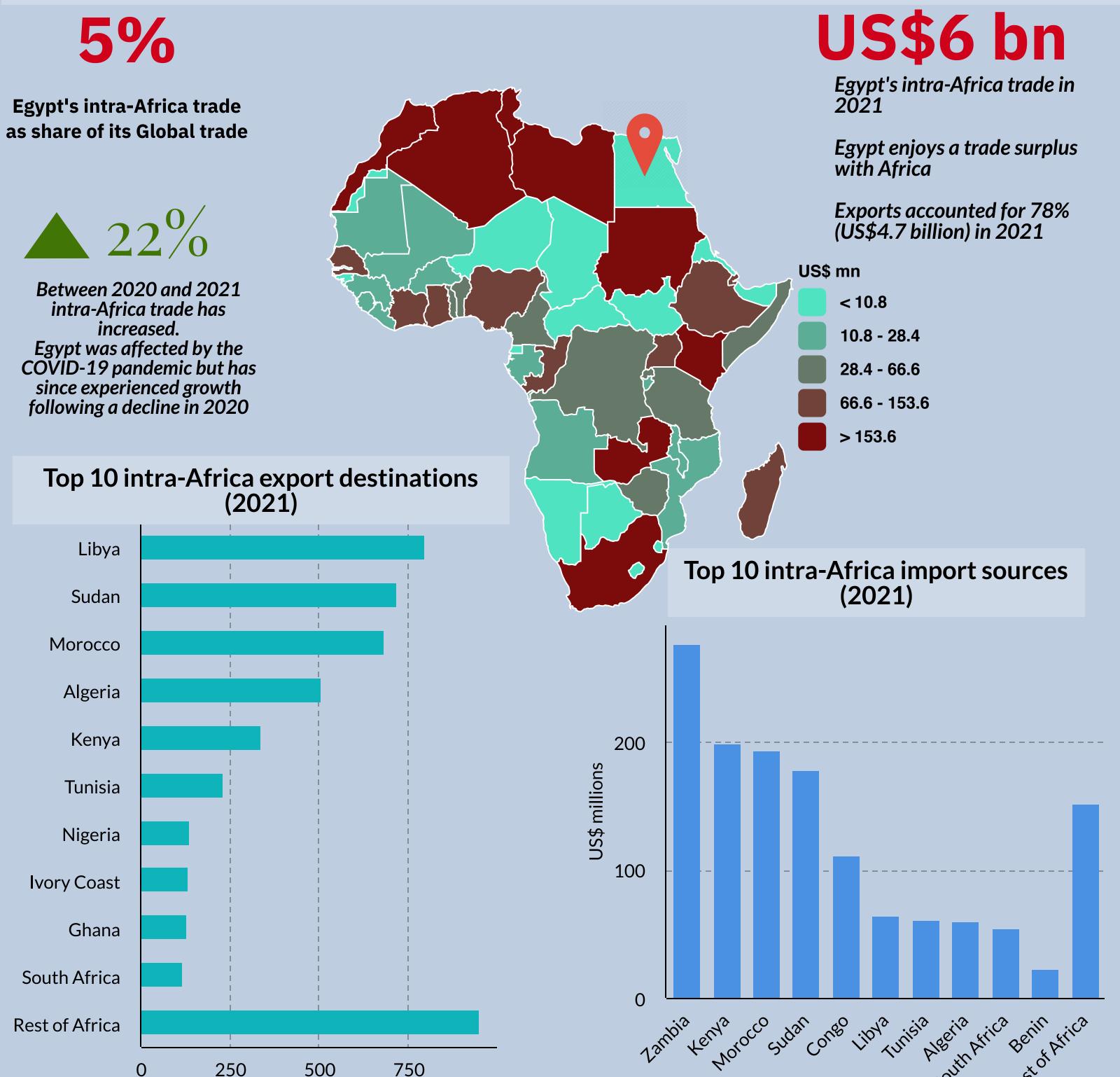
# EGYPT TRADE & TARIFF UPDATE (2021)

Egypt is a member of the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA), the Community of Sahel-Saharan States (CEN-SAD), Pan-Arab Free Trade Area (PAFTA) and the Arab-Mediterranean Free Trade Area (AGADIR)

Of these, only CONESA and CEN-SAD are recognised RECs CEN-SAD has no FTA and COMESA has an FTA and aims to establish a customs union Egypt has ratified the AfCFTA and has not yet submitted its revised tariff offer, but may well do so in the near

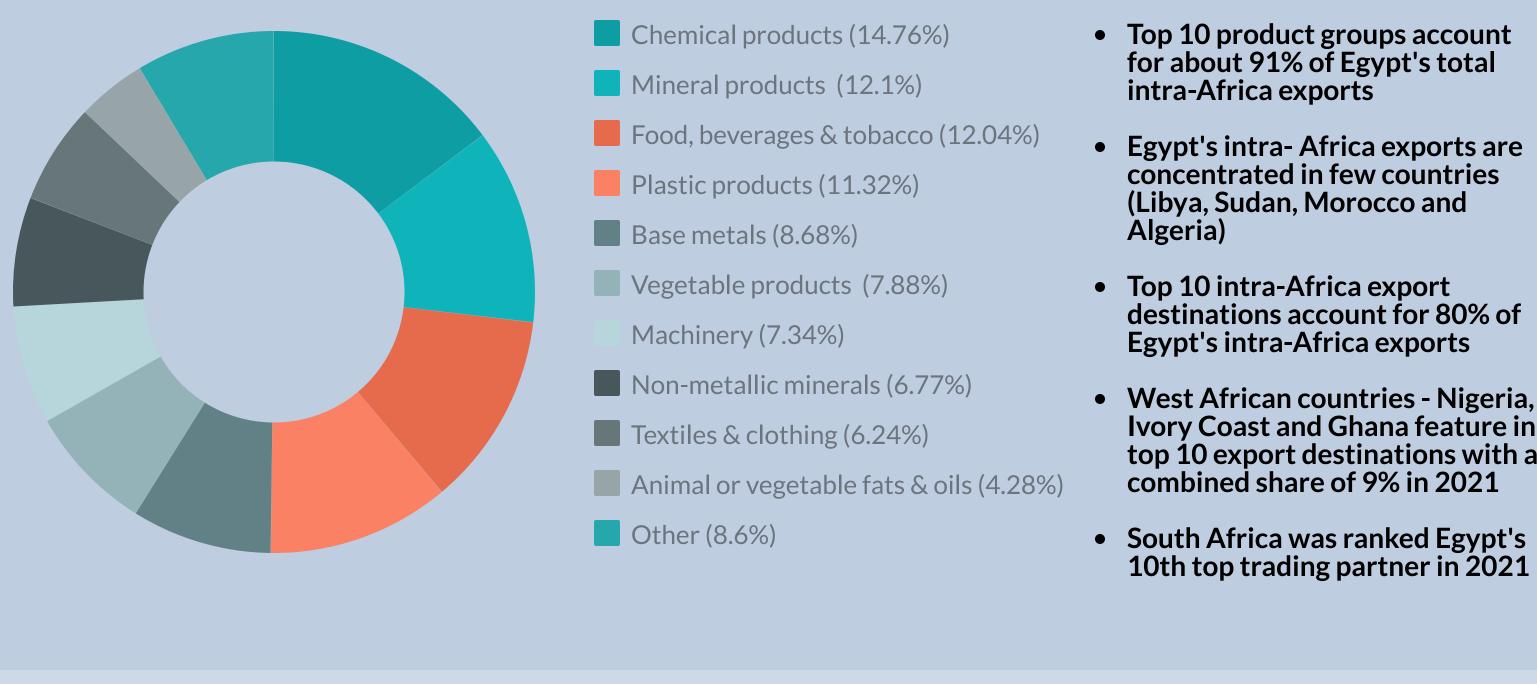

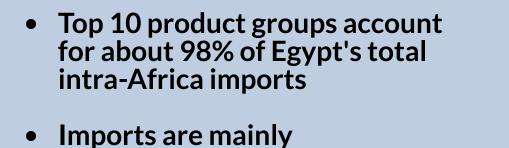

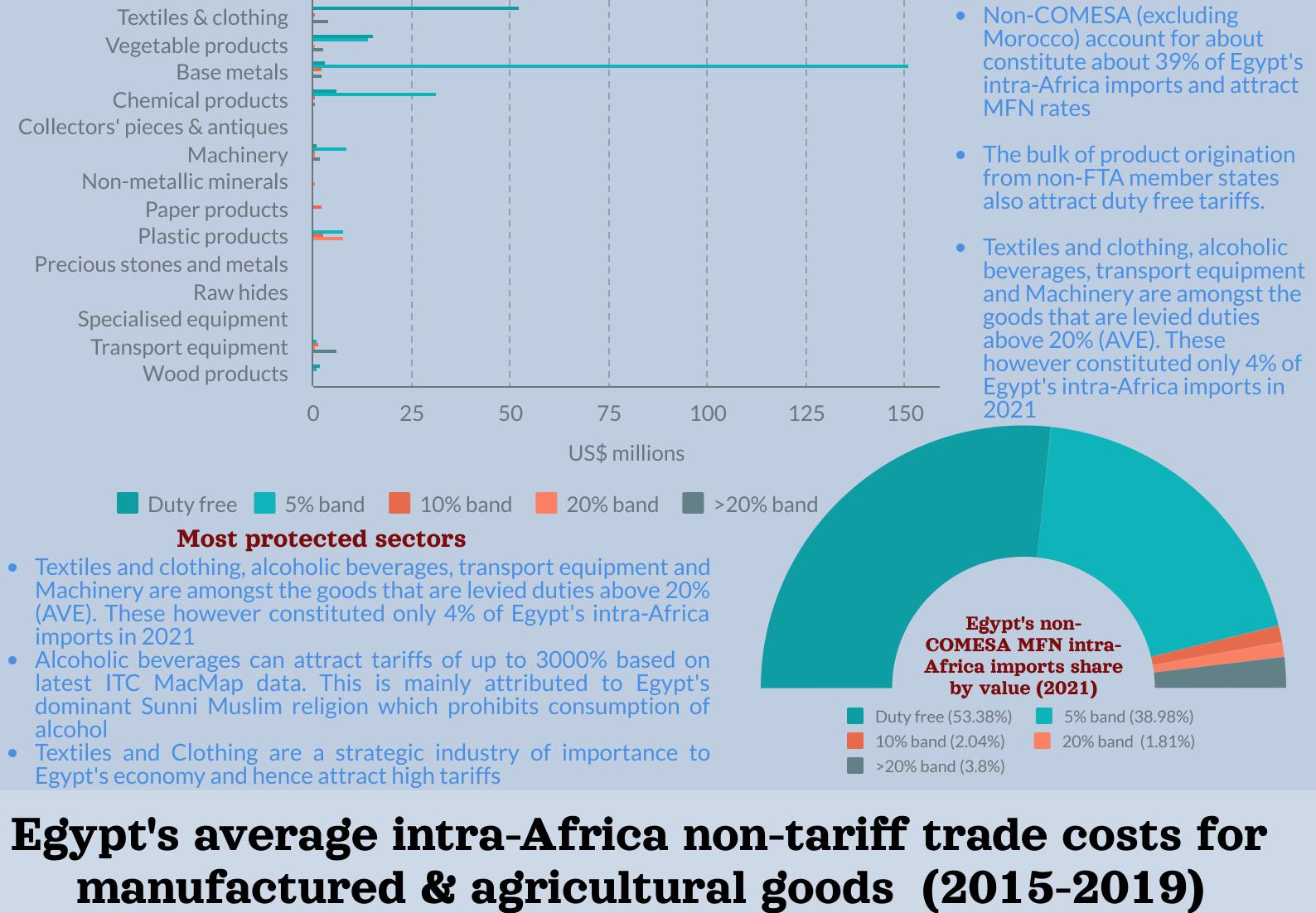
