

Uganda is a member of the East African Community (EAC), Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA) and the Intergovernmental Authority on Development (IGAD)

The EAC is a customs union (Burundi, Rwanda, South Sudan, Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania) with duty-free intra-EAC trade and a common external tariff (CET).

COMESA has 19 member states (including Eritrea, Ethiopia, Egypt, Eswatini, Malawi and Djibouti) of which 16 are part of the COMESA FTA. Eswatini has preferential access under derogations but is exempt from reciprocating peferences due to its membership of SACU. The DRC, Eritrea and Ethiopia are in the process of joining the FTA.

Djibouti, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Kenya, Somalia, South Sudan, Sudan and Uganda are the IGAD member states. No intra-IGAD tariff liberalisation has taken place.



Except for imports from the DRC, Eritrea, Ethiopia and Eswatini; imports from other COMESA members enter Uganda duty-free. Goods from Eswatini has preferential access under derogations. Imports from the DRC face MFN applied tariffs as well as goods from Somalia (non-COMESA IGAD member). Goods imported from Eritrea enjoy a margin of preference, which varies between 2% and 12%; up to 20% of the EAC CET. Products imported from Ethiopia are levied preferential tariffs of 9%, 18%, 22.5%, 31.5%, 45% and 54%; up to 90% of the EAC CET.

Uganda mainly imports iron and steel products, certain instruments and appliances, diesel trucks, refined sugar in solid form and uncoated paper from countries outside the EAC and COMESA. Of the top 10 products imported only three products are not imported duty-free; facing high (diesel trucks and uncoated paper at 25%) and excessive (refined sugar) tariffs.
