# Intra-Africa trade and tariff profile





Morocco is a member of the Arab Maghreb Union (AMU), the Community of Sahelo-Saharan States (CEN-SAD), the Pan-Arab Free Trade Area (PAFTA) and the Arab-Mediterranean Free Trade Area.

AMU is a regional economic community (REC) consisting of Algeria, Mauritania, Libya, Morocco and Tunisia. It does not yet have a free trade agreement in place.

CEN-SAD comprises of the AMU states (except Algeria), Benin, Burkina Faso, CAR, Chad, Comoros, Côte d'Ivoire, Djibouti, Eritrea, Egypt, Equatorial Guinea, Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Guinae-Bissau, Kenya, Liberia, Mali, Niger, Nigeria, São Tomé and Príncipe, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sudan and Togo. It does not yet have a free trade agreement in place.

PAFTA provides for trade liberalisation among 18 Arab countries (including Algeria, Egypt, Libya, Morocco, Sudan and Tunisia). The Arab-Mediterranean Free Trade Area provides full liberalisation of trade among Egypt, Morocco, Tunisia and Jordan.







Egypt grants duty free access to most import products from Arab-Mediterranean FTA, 33 African least-developed countries, Egypt, Euinea, Mauritania, Senegal and Tunisia. The only exceptions are live animals, meat and fish products, ores, slag and ash, nuts, pineapples, guavas and mangoes which are levied on ad valorem duties. The highest ad valorem duties are on live animals (32.67), meat and edible offal (41.64%), fish and crustaceans (30%), edible vegetables (20%).

Morocco mainly imports coal, bran, aluminium plates, sheets and strip, colbat oxides and hydroxides, vegetable fats and oils, transistors, diodes parts, vegetable seeds, palm and crude oils from countries with which it does not have any preferential trade arrangements.
