I wish to express our sincere gratitude to you all for honoring the SADC Chairperson's call to attend this important workshop, which offers a platform for all of us to discuss water and energy challenges in the Region, and come up with practical solutions.

Your Excellency,

Energy and water play a vital role in regional economic growth, and access to the same has a direct impact on the quality of lives of our people. Energy and water are fundamental enablers to economic development, and thus for industrialization, which SADC has frontloaded, a major focus of the region. SADC is home to more than 292 million people, out of which about 61 percent live in rural areas and derive their daily energy needs for space heating and cooking by collecting firewood, agricultural residues and animal waste by walking long

distances. A large majority of our citizens do not have access to modern commercial energy and electricity. Less than 40% of the population has access to electricity.

Water is one of the most shared resources through river basins and groundwater. Despite the water occurrence in relative abundance in the region, the situation is still very variable in both time and space. The prevailing drought induced by the El Nino phenomenon, continues to cause havoc, and will most likely further intensify the already volatile situation in the Region.

It is in recognition of these, and more related challenges, that the Chairperson of SADC, His Excellency, Lieutenant General Dr. Seretse Khama Ian Khama, President of the Republic of Botswana, has called for this workshop that brings together a number of key stakeholders from different sectors to act collectively in addressing the prevailing energy and water supply insecurity in the Region. The objective of the workshop is to facilitate exchange of ideas and forge practical and sustainable solutions in addressing energy and water crisis in the Region, with a view to mapping out a strategic direction. I am confident therefore, that this workshop will offer us an opportunity to deliberate on persistent challenges and come up with ways to address these challenges.

Allow me once again to welcome all of you to this very important Workshop. I wish to pay tribute to the Government and People of the Republic of Botswana for having put such wonderful facilities at our disposal.
