

What is monitoring?

➢Collection of information ► Tracking targets >On-going projects Remedial actions > Decision-making





What is evaluation?

Assessment ► Completed projects Effectiveness & Impact ► Future projects ➤Accountability

Timing- When? - Monitoring: on-going projects - Evaluation: completed projects






Objective-Why? - Monitoring: efficiency - Evaluation: effectiveness

Similarities between M & E

M & E must be planned at the program/ project level





Baseline data and appropriate indicators of performance and results

Relationship Between M&E

- >2 management tools: mutually supportive
- Monitoring data useful for evaluation
- Evaluations improved monitoring tools and strategies




