Dear Ambassadors/Permanent Representatives,

I am pleased to forward with this letter the 20<sup>th</sup> version of the Evolving Table on Cotton Development Assistance (WT/CFMC/6/Rev.19) for review by Members in advance of the next Round of the Director-General's Consultative Framework Mechanism on Cotton (DGCFMC).

The updated version of the Evolving Table (ET) registers contributions from Australia, Brazil, the European Union (and some of its Member States) and the United States, as well as from the IMF. Of particular significance is the support from Brazil, China and India on the platform of South-South Co-operation.

I am also pleased to share with Members the updated numerical values in the ET which show that progress is continuing on the implementation of commitments under the development assistance aspects of cotton. There has been, in particular, an improvement in the ratio between commitments and disbursements in Part I, which relates to "Cotton Specific Development Assistance", while that ratio in Part II, which lists "Agriculture and Infrastructure-Related Development Assistance", has remained stable.

The commitments and disbursements of active operational activities in the latest ET are highlighted as follows:

- In Part I, on **Cotton Specific Development Assistance**, the number of individual beneficiaries decreased to 28 from 30, whereas the total number of commitments increased to 35 from 34. The total value of commitments slightly decreased to US\$226.4 million from US\$247.1 in the previous version, mainly due to the transfer of several completed projects to the relevant Annex. The disbursement flows increased by US\$10.1 million to reach US\$102.3 million. The ratio of total disbursements to total commitments reached 45%, compared to 37% earlier.
- In Part II, on **Agriculture and Infrastructure-Related Development Assistance**, the number of individual beneficiaries increased to 32 from 27, while the total number of commitments decreased to 54 from 57. The total value of these commitments increased to US\$4.97 billion and the disbursement flows increased by US\$50 million to reach US\$3.05 billion. The ratio of total disbursements to total commitments slightly decreased to 61% from 63%.

I am also attaching the  $12^{th}$  version of the Table on Domestic Cotton Sector Reforms (WT/CFMC/21/Rev.11), reflecting new contributions from Benin and Mali, as well as the continuation of the efforts undertaken by Burkina Faso and Chad. These updates show the progress that the cotton proponents are making in reforming their cotton sector.

The 24<sup>th</sup> Round of the DGCFMC is scheduled to take place in the morning of 27 November 2015. The fourth Dedicated Discussion on the Relevant Trade-related Developments on Cotton, chaired by Ambassador Vitalis, the Chair of the Committee on Agriculture in Special Session, will take place back-to-back with the 24<sup>th</sup> Round, in the afternoon of the same day.

The enclosed documents will form the basis for the 24<sup>th</sup> Round of Consultations of the Consultative Framework Mechanism on Cotton, which will be chaired by DDG David Shark on my behalf.

## **Explanatory Notes**

- 1. The attached Table is divided into four Parts, as follows:
  - <u>Part 1</u>: Cotton Specific Development Assistance. This is assistance directly related to the cotton sector.
  - <u>Part II</u>: Agriculture and Infrastructure-Related Development Assistance. This is assistance related to cotton when provided under more general agricultural or infrastructure support programmes.
  - <u>Part III</u>: Available/Accessible Resources. This refers to assistance in the form of resources available from multilateral institutions through: i) Budget support provided in the Extended Credit Facility and the Poverty Reduction Support Credits (PRSCs); and, ii) Debt relief in the form of the Heavily Indebted Poor Countries Initiative (HIPC), Emergency Post-Conflict Assistance, Exogenous Shocks Facility, Rapid Credit Facility and the Multilateral Debt Relief Initiative (MDRI).
  - Part III was established in accordance with the outcome from the March 2007 High-Level Session on Cotton<sup>2</sup>. The purpose is to show "available" resources as distinguished from "committed" resources (see endnote "a" on page 16 which describes the nature of these resources). These could be deployed to any sector or activity on the basis of national development or poverty-reduction priorities.
  - <u>Part IV</u>: National Cotton Sector Focal Points. This Part provides the coordinates for focal points established by assistance beneficiaries for their engagement with the bilateral and multilateral development communities.
